Nursery Newsletter Autumn Term 2

Dear Parents

Welcome back to our second half of the autumn term. It has been lovely to see the children so excited to return to Nursery after the break.

Autumn 2 curriculum

This half term our themes are Under the Sea, Space and Rockets and Celebrations. These themes will be reflected in many of the stories we read, the nursery rhymes we sing and our art activities. This week we have read 'The Rainbow Fish', 'Tiddler', 'The Storm Whale' and 'The Snail and the Whale'. We have also learnt the rhyme 'I, 2, 3, 4, 5, Once I Caught a Fish Alive' and the children have really enjoyed playing in the new deep sea inspired role-play area.

Early phonics

This half term we are introducing phonics into our weekly routine. Phonics teaching in Nursery consists of developing the children's listening skills and their ability to distinguish individual sounds as well as appreciate rhythm, rhyme and alliteration through short, small group listening games. As part of this we will be introducing picture cards to represent each sound (phoneme) to prepare the children for learning the corresponding letters (graphemes) in Reception. For example, a picture of a tiger represents the sound 't', a penguin represents the 'p' sound and an iguana represents the 'i' sound. This is very exciting as it is the foundations for learning to read and write! We follow the excellent phonics and reading scheme called Little Wandle Letters and Sounds, which will continue into Reception, Year I and Year 2. This half term the children will learn the sounds **s**, **a**, **t**, **p**, **i**, **n**, **m**, starting with **s** this week.

Hurrah Cards

In Nursery we love celebrating each others' significant achievements. Please ask us for a Hurrah card if your child accomplishes something at home that you feel is special or important (e.g. learning to swim or ride a bike, getting dressed independently, drawing a beautiful picture, sleeping in their bed through the night, writing their name, helping to cook a meal etc), We will then share these special milestones with the whole class, giving each recipient a big Hurrah! and adding their card to our display.

Theatre Trip: Friday 5th December



This year, we have the wonderful opportunity to take the children to a concert hall in Kings Place at Kings Cross to see 'Mahler and the Mountain Adventure.' It is part of an Early Years project with the Aurora Orchestra and Haringey Music Service called 'Far Far Away', where musicians from the Aurora orchestra play classical music interspersed with story telling and lots of audience interaction. Given the time of the performance (10 am) and the age of the children, we will be hiring a coach to take us there and back, rather than taking the bus or tube. More information will follow, but please make a note of the date as we would love as many parents as possible to come too.

Nursery Christmas Concert: Tuesday 16th December

After the success of their brilliant performance in the EYFS Harvest Assembly at the end of last half term, the children will be returning to the stage and for the Nursery Christmas Concert on Tuesday 16th December at 2.45pm.
