We found an egg in the peace garden, it rolled out of its nest! Thanks, it was safe, so Reception children built a new home to grow.














PAINTING STILL LIFE TOYS _ Year 1

ANTARTIC LANDSCAPE COLLAGE _ Year 3











THE BIRD MOBILE_ Year 4







SCREEN PRINTING _ Year 6
